Bear Problems

Genoa has experienced problems with bears being attracted to their trash. Bear sightings are more common due to area growth, learned behavior of mother bears teaching their cubs about food located in trash cans, and because of this year's drought. It is expected the problem will worsen this fall.

The Genoa community can help with the bear problem:

- 1) Secure your trash: put trash out the morning of trash pickup
- 2) "Be Bear Aware" – Visit www.ndow.org and click on "Be Bear Aware" for information.

Due to a large volume of phone calls to NDOW, only report bears causing major problems. A bear getting into trash or a bear sighting in Genoa does not warrant a call. Wildlife Dispatch can be reached at (775) 688-1331.
