History of the Candy Dance

The Genoa Candy Dance originated in 1919 as an effort to raise money to purchase streetlights for the small but enterprising community of Genoa, Nevada's first settlement.

Lillian Virgin Finnegan, daughter of then prominent judge Daniel Webster Virgin, suggested the idea of a dance and making candy to pass around during the dance as an incentive for a good turnout of couples.

With the help of her aunt, Jane Raycraft Campbell, and the female populace of Genoa, she made delicious samples of candy, which really made the evening special. Of course, the midnight supper


convenient center of town location and easy access parking. The couple, local residents of Genoa, have worked in real estate for over seven years and opened the new office in June


have a satellite office, Gillmor & Associates in Santa Clara, California, which has been open since 1965 and specializes in income properties and general residential.

served at the Raycraft Hotel was, as always, a culinary delight. So, if the candy did not entice people to join in the fun, the midnight supper was surely an incentive.

The Genoa community did raise the needed funds for streetlights, but realized the monthly electric bill had to be paid. The candy makers were then called upon each year to help promote the Candy Dance and pay a year's worth of electricity for the streetlights throughout the town. This annual event became the Big Event of the season. Couples came from Reno, Carson City, Minden, Gardnerville, Centerville, Mottsville, Sheridan and other nearby communities to join in the evening of fun.

The Arts & Crafts Faire was added in the 1970s and later became a two-day event. The first Faire was held on the front lawn of a private residence in Sierra Shadows on Genoa Lane with 12 vendors. A few years later the popular Faire was moved to the Mormon Station Historic State Monument grounds. Expanding proved necessary and now Faire exhibitors are also found in the Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street and in other locations.

The Candy Dance dinner dance is still held each year with the sounds of a live band playing everything from rock, western, swing and hip hop to waltzes for people of all ages. Everyone is invited to the Saturday night dinner dance. Tickets are sold in advance. Generations of Genoa residents have continued the Candy Dance tradition that their mothers, grandmothers and great-grandmothers worked so hard to establish. The funds raised by the Town of Genoa during the Candy Dance weekend provide a substantial portion of the town's annual budget.

We are about to celebrate the 88th Candy Dance—year 2008. We thank the volunteers past and present for keeping the Candy Dance tradition alive!



Communicating With the Community

Spotlight on Non-Profit Genoa Courthouse Museum

The Courthouse Museum is one of Genoa's most popular tourist attractions, drawing visitors from virtually every state in the union and as far away as Europe. It is open May 1 through mid-September, from 10 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. Located on Main Street, it was originally constructed in 1865 when Genoa was the county seat of Douglas County. The original structure burned down in 1910, was rebuilt, and continued to serve as a courthouse until the county seat moved to Minden in 1916. It was then converted into a one-room, grades 1-8 schoolhouse for the Town until 1956.

In 1961 a group of descendants of Carson Valley pioneers organized the Carson Valley Historical Society. They undertook an extensive restoration program, repairing the exterior and restoring the interior of the building and in 1969 the Genoa Courthouse, became the realization of the dream they had envisioned. The CVHS which now holds title to the property, maintains it and keeps it open seven days a week, six months a year with the help of volunteers.

The first floor is the site of the original two-cell jailhouse, and the second floor has been recreated to look as it did in the 1860s, containing much of the original oak furniture from the Genoa and Minden courthouse.

The museum houses several excellent exhibits, the prize of which may well be the Basket Room. Among the many varieties of baskets is one made by *Datsolalee*, which means "The Queen of Washoe Indian Basket Makers." Dat-So-La-Lee baskets are regarded by experts as among the finest examples of Native American basket weaving in the world.

**Quick Tips For Living in
Bear Country**

- Use bear-proof garbage cans whenever possible or store your garbage in a secure location with your food.
 - Keep food indoors or in airtight and odor-free containers.
 - Put away picnic leftovers; clean BBQ grills.
 - Keep pet food inside.
 - Pick up fallen tree fruit as soon as possible, or protect fruit trees with electric fencing.
 - Remove cosmetic fragrances and other attractants, including bird feeders and compost piles.
- Install or request bear-proof trash containers.
 - Keep a close watch on children, and teach them what to do if they encounter a bear.
 - While hiking, make noise to avoid a surprise encounter with a bear.
 - Never approach a bear or pick up a bear cub.
 - If you encounter a bear, do not run; instead, remain facing towards the animal, talk in a quiet, firm voice and appear as large as possible while backing away to a safe location.
 - If attacked, fight back.
 - If a bear attacks a person, immediately call 911.

When wild animals are allowed to feed on human food and garbage, they lose their natural ways—often resulting in death for the animal. Please respect and protect wild animals.



Yes, Genoans, There is a "Genoa Historic District" *by Marian Vassar*

The Genoa Historic District was created in 1974 by Douglas County under Nevada Law (NRS 384) to administer regulations within the Historic District applicable to commercial property. The County Commissioners then appointed a Genoa Historic District Commission. This Commission has five members who serve two-year terms.

In 1992, *Information, Guidelines, Regulations* was adopted by the Genoa Historic District Commission (GHDC) as a guide for consistency in performing its responsibilities. These guidelines derive their authority from Douglas County ordinances. This authority applies only to the external, visible design of the property.

The purpose of the GHDC is to help maintain the historic integrity of Genoa through implementation of these guidelines. Owners of commercial property are required to submit their plans to the GHDC for review and for a Certificate of Appropriateness prior to issuance of permits required by the County.

External and visible design refers to scale, mass, proportion, height, roof line, external surface including color, windows, entrances and streetscape (building setbacks, fences, lights, paving, out buildings, benches, signs, etc.).

Although there may be some gray areas in these guidelines, it is in the best interest of our commercial property owners to present their plans for construction, reconstruction, additions, fences, signage, etc., to GHDC for approval prior to commencing construction. Our Historic District designation lasts only as long as the historic appearance and value of Genoa are insured. The GHDC is committed to protecting this designation.

The GHDC meets on the third Monday of each month **WHEN THERE IS BUSINESS TO CONDUCT**. Applications for a Certificate of Appropriateness must be submitted to: GHDC, Post Office Box 101, Genoa, NV 89411. After they are received, a meeting date is scheduled and agenda and plans are posted in areas designated by the County for a minimum of 10 days prior to the meeting.


