delivered to the homes of Genoa residents before September 20. Detours are set up during Candy Dance as a result of road closures during the event.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL CONCERNED, UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO DRIVE THROUGH DOWNTOWN DURING CANDY DANCE FAIRE HOURS.

(All emergency, police and fire vehicles are exempt from this policy for any police or medical emergencies or fires within the town.)

Detours are set up to provide access to residents. However, all traffic is diverted from downtown Genoa during Candy Dance hours. Residents are allowed into the Town but only on detour roads – **MAPS ARE AVAILABLE ON THE BACK OF PASSES TO DIRECT RESIDENTS TO THE DETOURS.** This is being done out of concern for public safety and town liability during the Candy Dance Faire weekend, when 30,000 to 50,000 visitors will be walking the streets of Genoa. We appreciate your understanding and

cooperation in this matter.

Road closures within the Town of Genoa will occur Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 28-29 between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

ROAD CLOSURES DURING CANDY DANCE

Highway 395 drops to one lane before the intersection with Genoa Lane. When it is time to leave town from Genoa Lane, left turns are not permitted. It is best to travel south towards Highway 395 and make a u-turn. Safest place to do that is at the light at Highway 395 and 88. *(See the map on our website details.)*

PLEASE LEAVE YOUR PETS AT HOME

Pets are not allowed at the Candy Dance event or at Mormon Station State Park except for dogs in training for the impaired/handicapped. There are thousands of people in town during the two-day event and this combined with hot weather may stress your pet. **Please leave them at home.**
